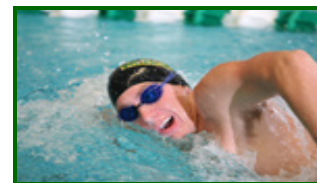

Telephone Calls to Prospective Student-Athletes (Bylaw 13.1.3)

Time Period for Telephone Calls (Bylaw 13.1.3.1)

Telephone calls to a prospective student-athlete [or the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardian (s)] may not be made before **July 1** following the completion of the prospective student-athlete's **junior year** in high school (subject to the exceptions below); thereafter, staff members shall not make such telephone calls more than once per week.

Exception -- Men's Basketball (Bylaw 13.1.3.1.2)

In men's basketball, an institution is permitted to make one telephone call per month to a prospective student-athlete (or the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardians) on or after June 15 of the prospective student-athlete's sophomore year in high school through July 31 of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school. An institution is permitted to make two telephone calls per week to a prospective student-athlete (or the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardians) beginning August 1 prior to the prospective student-athlete's senior year in high school. An institution is permitted to make one telephone call per week to a two-year or four-year college prospective student-athlete (or the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardians).

Exception -- Women's Basketball (Bylaw 13.1.3.1.3)

In women's basketball, telephone calls may be made to a prospective student-athlete (or the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardians) as follows:

- (a) One telephone call during the month of April of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school on or after the Thursday after the conclusion of the NCAA Division I Women's Final Four.
- (b) One telephone call during the month of May of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school.
- (c) One telephone call on or after June 1 through June 20 of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school.
- (d) One telephone call on or after June 21 through June 30 of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school.
- (e) Three telephone calls during the month of July following the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school, with no more than one telephone call per week.
- (f) Thereafter, one telephone call per week.

Definitions

Recruiting Periods (Bylaw 13.02.4)

Contact Period. A contact period is a period of time when it is permissible for authorized athletics department staff members to make in-person, off campus recruiting contact and evaluations.

Evaluation Period. An evaluation period is a period of time when it is permissible for authorized department staff members to be involved in off-campus activities designed to assess the academic qualifications and playing ability of prospective student-athletes. NO in-person, off campus recruiting contacts shall be made with the prospective student-athlete during an evaluation period.

Quiet Period. A quiet period is a period of time when it is permissible to make in-person recruiting contacts ONLY on the institution's campus. No in-person, off campus recruiting contacts or evaluations may be made during the quiet period.

Dead Period. A dead period is a period of time when it is not permissible to make in-person recruiting contacts or evaluations on or off the institution's campus or to permit official or unofficial visits by prospective student-athletes to the institution's campus. The provision of complimentary admissions to a prospective student-athlete during a dead period is prohibited, except as provided by Bylaw 13.7.2.5. During the dead period, a coaching staff member may not serve as a speaker, attend a meeting or banquet at which a prospective student-athletes are in attendance and may not visit a prospective student-athletes institution. It remains permissible however, for an institutional staff member to write or telephone a prospective-student athlete.

Telephone Calls to Perspective Student-Athletes continued:

Additional Restrictions -- July Evaluation Periods (Bylaw 13.1.3.1.3.2)

In women's basketball, during the July evaluation periods, all communication with a prospective student-athlete, the prospective student-athlete's relatives or legal guardians, the prospective student-athlete's coach or any individual associated with the prospective student-athlete as a result of the prospective student-athlete's participation in basketball, directly or indirectly, is prohibited.

Official (PAID) Visit

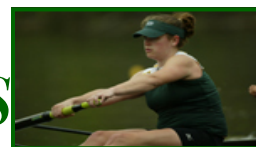
Non qualifier in First Year (Bylaw 13.6.2.3.1)

A person who is not a qualifier and who is enrolled at a **two-year college** may not be provided an expense-paid visit to a member institution until he or she has completed an academic year at a two year college.

Transfer Student (Bylaw 13.6.3.2)

If a student-athlete attending a four-year institution desires to transfer and that institution provides the permission required (per Bylaw 13.1.1.3), it is permissible for a second institution to provide the student-athlete one official visit to that institution's campus.

AWARDS AND BENEFITS



Extra Benefit (Bylaw 16.02.3)

An extra benefit is any special arrangement by an institutional employee or a representative of the institution's athletics interests to provide a student-athlete or student-athlete's relative or friend a benefit not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation. Receipt of a benefit by student-athletes or their relatives or friends is not a violation of NCAA legislation if it is demonstrated that the same benefit is generally available to the institution's students or relatives or friends or to a particular segment of the student body (e.g., foreign students, minority students) determined on a basis unrelated to athletics ability.

Competition While Representing Institution (Bylaw 16.8.1.2)

An institution may provide actual and necessary travel expenses (e.g., transportation, lodging and meals) to a student-athlete for participation in athletics competition, provided the student-athlete is representing the institution (competes in the uniform of the institution) and is eligible for intercollegiate competition. Violations of this bylaw shall be considered an institutional violation per Constitution 2.8.1; however, they shall not affect the student-athlete's eligibility.
